

The Power Worshippers

INSIDE THE DANGEROUS RISE OF RELIGIOUS NATIONALISM

America's Religious Right has evolved into a Christian nationalist movement. It seeks to gain political power and to impose its vision on all of society.

Faith & Freedom Coalition's annual Road to Majority convention: "This party—or at least the hard rock of its base represented in this gathering—is moving toward, not away from Trumpism."

At the convention, speakers including Eric Metaxas, Ralph Reed, and Dinesh D'Souza all called for Republicans to defend the "good guys" of January 6, by which they meant the violent insurgents who tried to overthrow a legitimate election.

My interest in this area first started in 1995 when a local couple were kidnapped by a group planning to build a, 'Whites only Ethno-state'. I later found out my neighbors, Chevie and Chyene Kehoe, were involved. They were later convicted of murder.

Over time several other local stories involving white supremacy were mentally cataloged. I realized some of my neighbors were members of the Klan, which included the leader of the KKK in my state.

Many more neighbors had ties to Neo-Nazis.

Christian Identity adherents had their own community located down the road from me.

In 2012, I heard a local man who I was told had ties to these groups was selected to replace a retiring Senator, alarm bells sounded.

Over the next 10 months I spent hours trying to find information on the background of this new Senator. Google Search and I became good friends and I learned tricks on how to dig deeper into the Web.

I soon had the goods to take to the local paper as well as having learned a lot more about other groups operating in the region and their ties to extremist.

I've been involved in at least a dozen investigations since 2012 and have helped take down politicians with extremist views and learned the identity of a few individuals that the FBI was unable to ascertain.

I'm still somewhat active and recently identified a couple individuals that took part in the Jan. 6 Capitol insurrection.

The extremist hate and intolerance that motivated the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks continue to pose a serious threat to the United States.

But over the past 20 years, the threat landscape has changed dramatically.

Two decades after 9/11, right-wing extremist violence poses by far the greatest threat to everyone in this country.

Dominionism And Christian Identity

Christian nationalists believe in a revisionist history, which holds that the founders were devout Christians who never intended to create a secular republic; separation of church and state, according to this history, is a fraud perpetrated by God-hating subversives.



Christian Identity

is a unique antisemitic and racist **theology** that rose to a position of commanding influence on the racist right in the 1980s. "Christian" in name only, it asserts that white people, **not Jews**, are the true Israelites favored by God in the Bible.


Christian Identity is NOT affiliated with specific <u>Christian</u> <u>denominations</u>. Its <u>theology</u> is a racial interpretation of Christianity.

Christian Identity beliefs were primarily developed and promoted by authors who regarded Europeans as the "chosen people" and Jews as the cursed offspring of Cain, the "serpent hybrid" or serpent seed.

(a belief which is known as the two-seedline doctrine). White supremacist sects and prison gangs later adopted many of these teachings.

The Christian Identity movement first received widespread attention from the mainstream media in 1984, when the white nationalist organization The Order embarked on a murderous crime spree before it was suppressed by the FBI.

Robert, Mathews and eight other men—some neo-Nazi militants and other participants in the racist <u>Christian</u> <u>Identity</u> movement—took an oath to work toward a white supremacist society



Christian Identity provided the militant piece to the puzzle, Dominionism has provided the road map.


Working together the militia movement has their marching orders. The Christian Patriot Militia Movement is the coming together of those two ideologies to successfully implement the 7 Mountains Mandate.

Christian Identity beliefs are pervasive in the upper echelon of the patriot movement, and this is not an accident.

Two events are often sited as the impetus for the modern Christian Militia Movement.

More than any other issue the deadly standoffs at Ruby Ridge, Idaho, in 1992 and Waco, Texas, in 1993 ignited widespread passion.

To most Americans, these events were tragedies, but to the extreme right, they were examples of a government willing to stop at nothing to stamp out people who refused to conform.

The significance of Estes Park!

What happened at Estes Park Colorado in October 1992 and why the meeting was significant.

Pastor Pete Peters had signaled to the Christian Reconstructionist that there was common ideological, if not theological ground between the two religious' movements, while leaving considerable theological differences aside.

The meeting had a wide variety of religious adherents including Christian Identity, Baptist, Church of Christ and Mennonites.

The angry rhetoric at the Rendezvous flowed in one direction—at the federal government. Not the Jews, not the blacks, not the homosexuals, not the abortionist. The enemy was defined clearly as the federal government and the New World Order.

According to Morris Dees of the SPLC, the "Estes Park meeting actually established a working structure for the current militia/Christian Patriot Movement."

THE CONFERENCE "EMBRACED THE CONCEPT OF CHURCH MILITIAS".



Militias



Militias

- The American militia movement had been mostly dormant, but the election of Barack Obama gave it new life - and thousands of new members.
- There are currently hundreds of small local militias in the US, groups of "patriotic citizens" who own a lot of weaponry and spend a lot of time tramping through various wilderness areas training to use them.
- These groups train to prepare for what they see as the inevitable consequences of a Democratic president, such as gun confiscation, martial law, imprisonment of dissenters, mass purges, and totalitarian fascism.
- Most of these groups are also opposed to federal law and feel they're somehow above the rules that the rest of us live by. This means many have been shut down and raided by police or the FBI - with some groups involved in plots to overthrow the presidency and other serious infractions.

Arizona has been a hotbed for militia groups for years. With the border being an issue, numerous homegrown as well as out of state groups have come and gone, but often leaving a trail of misdeeds behind.

Probably the most memorable case happened not far from here in Arivaca, when members of a Minutemen militia murdered a father, his young daughter and leaving her mother to die.



On May 30, 2009, 29-year-old Raul Flores Jr. and his daughter, nine-year-old Brisenia Flores, were murdered during a home invasion in Arivaca, Arizona. The perpetrators were Shawna Forde, Jason Eugene Bush and Albert Gaxiola, all members of Forde's vigilante nativist group, Minutemen American Defense (MAD). Gina Gonzalez, the victims' wife and mother, was wounded but survived the attack after exchanging gunfire with the intruders, wounding Bush.

In 2011, all three assailants were convicted of murder. Forde and Bush were sentenced to death, while Gaxiola was sentenced to life in prison without parole.

The realization that a training facility for The BASE, a neo-Nazi white supremacist paramilitary hate group was in Washington State sent shock waves through the media.

Rinaldo Nazzaro, aka, Roman Wolf founded the BASE in 2018.

Rinaldo used to work for the FBI, Pentagon, and CIA before moving to Russia at the time he created the group.

The Base's goal is to unite white nationalists for the coming race war that will overthrow the government and reshape society.


- The Boogaloos —
- Have been calling for a <u>civil war</u> as well as a race war and seeks the violent overthrow of the U.S. government.
- Boogaloo members also openly advocate killing police officers.
- In Northern California, <u>Boogaloo supporter</u>
 <u>Steven Carrillo</u> was arrested in connection with an armed attack on a federal courthouse in Oakland on May 29.
- That attack left a security officer from the Federal Protective Service dead.



The Three Percenters movement

- The Three Percenters aren't one specific group, but rather, a movement of far-right militias.
- Three Percenters are well-armed and engage in military-like training, and they have made it clear that they are fully prepared for armed struggle.
- According to the Southern Poverty Law Center,
 "Percenterism is one of three core components within
 the anti-government militia movement, along with the
 Oath Keepers and traditional militia groups.
- The reference to '3 Percent' stems from the dubious historical claim that only 3% of American colonists fought against the British during the War of Independence.

The Proud Boys

Trump expressed his solidarity with the farright Proud Boys — a group of self-described "western chauvinists" who openly advocate violence and have been carrying out violent attacks against members of Black Lives Matter at anti-racism demonstrations.

After Trump's endorsement, members of the Proud Boys expressed their <u>feelings of empowerment</u> and declared that they were ready to carry out acts of violence on the president's behalf.

President Trump asked the Proud Boys to 'stand by.'

There is evidence that members of the Proud Boys are more involved in the Jan 6 insurrection than first realized. Roger Stone was surrounded by PBs on Jan 5 and 6 during secret meetings at a DC hotel. They may have been a bigger part of the story than the Oath Keepers.

<u>Right-wing political violence</u> and other antisocial and destructive behavior are gradually becoming normalized across American society.

The events of Jan. 6 were a logical next step. As law enforcement and other terrorism experts have repeatedly warned, that was not the end of a wave of right-wing violence in America but just another stage in a centuries-long journey.

The next step could well be <u>a sustained</u> <u>right-wing insurgency</u> against multiracial democracy.

OATH KEEPERS

The Oath Keepers, which claims tens of thousands of present and former law enforcement officials and military veterans as members, is one of the largest radical antigovernment groups in the U.S. today.

While it claims only to be defending the Constitution, the entire organization is based on a set of baseless conspiracy theories about the federal government working to destroy the liberties of Americans.

QAnon






- The <u>QAnon movement</u> has been identified by the FBI as a possible source of domestic terrorism, and its sympathizers are making their way to the U.S. House of Representatives.
- In Georgia, QAnon supporter Marjorie Taylor Greene and Lauren Boebert won seats in Congress in November, which is incredibly disturbing when one considers what QAnon believes.
- According to the QAnon conspiracy theory, the U.S. government has been infiltrated by an international ring of pedophiles and Satanists, and Trump was put in power to combat the ring.
- According to QAnon, an anonymous figure named Q is giving them updates on Trump's battle.

The QAnon assertion that Satanist Democrats are farming children underground in order to harvest and drink their blood harkens back to an even older conspiracy theory, the antisemitic blood libel, a medieval fiction that concluded that Jewish people stole and murdered Christian children in order to use their blood to make matzah.

Supporters of the far-right wing group **QAnon are spreading a dangerous conspiracy** theory that the blood of kidnapped children is being harvested by liberal elites for a drug called adrenochrome, which they say offers a psychedelic experience and even holds the promise of immortality for those who take it,

Looks to me the Democratic Party needs to address the QAnon phenomenon.




Donald Trump is now backing a QAnon conspiracy theorist to run Arizona's elections as Secretary of State.

Because Trump remains the unquestioned leader of the Republican Party, Mark Finchem's chances of winning soared thanks to the endorsement. "Thank you, President Trump for your endorsement," het-weeted. "You are leading the way on restoring election integrity. I am truly honored to be recognized for the hard work I put in and will continue to do to restore the integrity of our elections."

If the idea of someone with Finchem's conspiracy driven beliefs overseeing a critical swing state's election process, you aren't paying attention. This is how confidence in American elections erodes. And when that happens, we will be in a country that is literally unrecognizable.

Is it legal to act as a private militia in Arizona?

No. All 50 states prohibit private, unauthorized militias and military units from engaging in activities reserved for the state militia, including law enforcement activities.

The Arizona Constitution forbids private military units from operating outside state
Authority.







Special Agent Matthew Catalano reviewed the file titled "151105b Special OMD 46. AB meeting.mp3" located in the "OMD" folder of Dropbox user account ID 328858080, which was seized from Dropbox, Inc. pursuant to search warrant 2:16-mj-000224-NJK in the District of Nevada. This file is an audio recording of a conference call-style conversation between selfproclaimed Operation Mutual Defense ("OMD") Advisory Board members Gary HUNT, Ryan PAYNE, Jon RITZHEIMER, Timothy FOLEY and Dennis DICKENSON. This recording is approximately 1 hour, 18 minutes and 48 seconds long. At the beginning of this recording Gary HUNT identified the meeting as a continuation of the earlier meeting on the same day and the time as 5:02 Pacific Time. HUNT said that all members of the OMD Advisory Board were present and he then turned the meeting over to Ryan PAYNE. PAYNE said that he was currently traveling through the "desolation of Oregon." The conversation was centered on the HAMMOND situation and OMD's potential response with Ammon BUNDY. At the end of the conversation the OMD Advisory Board also discussed William WOLF and discussed options to break him out of federal custody, wherein PAYNE discussed the use of a protest movement to do so, in a similar plan used at the BUNDY Ranch. The following is a review of this recording.


- At 0:06:09, the OMD Advisory Board discussed the language for the OMD signoff and the sanctioning of Lewis ARTHUR's mission in Arizona, Veterans on Patrol.
 - At 0:25:58, HUNT mentioned the OMD Degrees of Involvement.
- 17. At 0:29:32, HUNT provided an update on the person using the moniker "Raven" and the OMD Advisory Board decided to not spend any additional time trying to identify Raven.
- 18. At 0:32:00, HUNT spoke about Timothy MCVEIGH. HUNT shared that he corresponded with MCVEIGH at the end of his life. HUNT said that he wrote articles and posted his correspondence with MCVEIGH on his website. HUNT said that he regarded MCVEIGH as the first patriot in the 2nd. American Revolution and he defended his actions attacking a government building.

Most of the "Guardians of the Border" groups have disappeared from FB, a favorite place to share their exploits.






In the tiny community of Bunkerville, Nv, a rally cry was sent out to militias across the country to come to the aid of rancher, Cliven Bundy.

The Bureau of Land Management decided after 20 years of nonpayment from Bundy for his cattle's gracing rights on Federal Land, it was time to remove his cattle.

Within hours militia groups and others started arriving at the ranch in Support of Bundy. Shortly thereafter a standoff between Federal agents and men bearing arms took place.

The fact that the Federal Government bungled the case against the Bundys has opened the floodgates for actions like we saw on Jan 6.

Time will tell if the Department of Justice is successful in their prosecution of the hundreds of cases now being handled.

You see we need to activate because if we do not activate and rise up and push back against this tyranny, against this communist invasion—because let's face it, that's what this is, it's a communist invasion—we will not have an America. And let me tell you: When America falls, there is no place else to run or hide.

Foley presents himself as a veteran of the 82d Airborne Division who took an oath to defend the country from foreign and domestic enemies that still drives his life.

Well, his story of his military career is true, but not to the extent that Foley would like you to believe. He was a soldier, he was a paratrooper in the 82d Airborne Division's 307th Engineer Battalion, but only for a very brief period. 



Concerning political affiliation, the adamant insurrectionists are not only Republicans.

51% self-identify as members of the Republican Party,

34% see themselves as Independents

10% as Democrats.

All this tells us is that the insurrectionist movement is more mainstream, cross-party, and more complex than many people might like to think, which does not bode well for the 2022 mid-term elections, or for that matter, the 2024 Presidential election.

Ironically, the solution may be more local than national. Of the ardent insurrectionists, 47 percent see the Federal Government as an "enemy", 56 percent feel the same way about state governments, but 73 percent see local governments as non-enemy actors. With the latter being the most trusted sources, mayors could potentially have outsized influence over the future of the movement.

"Over the last decade, 429 innocent victims were murdered at the hands of extremists. The overwhelming majority of whom were far, far right extremists and white supremacists," he said. "But we also know full well that you don't have to be an official card-carrying extremist to cause harm. The problem we see is that violence motivated by hate, anti-Semitism, and other forms of bigotry increasingly has been normalized."

Important Events that gave rise to the Christian Patriot Movement.

The notorious <u>Ruby Ridge</u> standoff of August 1992, when U.S. marshals attempted to apprehend a man named <u>Randy Weaver</u> at his family's remote hillside cabin in northern Idaho. Weaver, who had resisted efforts by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (ATF) to force him to inform on the white supremacist group Aryan Nations, hadn't shown up for his trial on weapons charges.

An initial exchange of fire left Weaver's 14-year-old son and a U.S. marshal dead. Federal authorities then laid siege to Weaver's cabin for 11 days, during which an FBI sniper wounded Weaver and family friend Kevin Harris and killed Weaver's wife. Vicki. McVeigh reacted even more strongly to federal authorities' handling of a 51-day standoff with members of the Branch Davidian religious sect near Waco, Texas. Like Ruby Ridge, the Waco siege began with an ATF raid; it ended in a fire that killed around 75 members of the millennial sect in April 1993

On April 19, 1995 – exactly two years after the fiery conclusion of the botched Waco siege – McVeigh detonated explosives planted in a truck outside the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City. He plotted the attack with two fellow Army veterans who shared his anti-government views, <u>Terry Nichols</u> and Michael Fortier. *Gary Hunt is considered by some to be the 5th member of McVeigh's group.

The document elaborates that the men felt a "spiritual burden": "This burden was the need and desire to see Biblical principles of government once again established in our nation," it reads. The men agreed that if they could not come to a consensus on solving that burden, they would not proceed with writing the document.

What comes next are resolutions to fix society for "the remnant" — the way for the chosen people to live in the fullest realization of liberty. Biblical principles should be put into practice at every level of government.
